TITLING AND LIEN PERFECTION ISSUES

On March 19, 2020, we shared the official order (attached below) from the Transportation Cabinet with emergency provisions that included a 90-day extension for temp tags and lien filings.

There have been questions posed by dealers concerning the effect of state agency orders allowing an extension of time for temporary tags, title processing and lien perfection. We are advised by counsel, that the consensus of legal opinion of attorneys and various organizations to which they belong, that:

1. Dealers should continue to complete deal documentation as usual.
2. The general rule is that bankruptcy courts follow state law. As long as the state has issued a duly promulgated order extending administrative functions, the consensus of opinion is that the bankruptcy judge would take that into account in determining the validity of the lien.

3. We believe that lenders we are familiar with have come to the same conclusion. If dealers are being advised by lenders of a different position, please let us know.

We will continue to follow these developments closely and will issue updates as warranted.
